WHO Belfast Healthy City Awards 2022 Categories

Impact Award

This will be awarded to an individual whose work has a strong, recognisable and tangible impact in the city. This may be through their leadership within an influential organisation, or their delivery of health and well-being related programmes over a long period. It may also include those who have been to the fore of positive health and wellbeing promotion in the city, or who may have positively impacted the lives of citizens.

Nominations of people for the Impact Award can be made by an individual or an organisation.

Healthy Champion Awards

The Healthy Champion will present three awards, two for individuals including one specifically open to young Healthy Cities Champions (aged 16-25), and one for an organisation.

The HEALTHY CHAMPION awards will be presented to a young person; an individual; and an organisation who have made significant contribution to health well-being in the city through one or more of the Healthy Cities Phase VII themes:
